WA COMPANION CARD

With the school holidays coming up you may be considering some family activities and day trips. If you haven't considered getting a WA Companion Card, its time! The WA Companion Card is a free card for those who have a significant permanent disability and require 'attendant care support.' Card holders can show the card when purchasing tickets at places like AQWA, Perth Zoo and the movies, and they will allow the 'attendant/carer' to enter for free. They also have a family key to change rooms and toilets around Perth that are quieter and accommodate for high care needs.
